

Local Laws Changing for Community Safety

As part of a commitment to maintaining a safe and inclusive community, Balonne Shire Council has adopted new Local Laws relating to keeping animals in town areas. These Local Laws will be in place from 1 July 2023.

Balonne Shire Mayor Samantha O'Toole said the changes relate to regulating and managing which animals can be kept in town areas and how those animals are kept and controlled.

"In making these changes, our first priority was to protect the community against risk of injury from animals," she said.

"We also want to ensure that animals are kept in ways consistent with community expectations, that they are kept responsibly and that we minimise opportunities for animals to create a nuisance, or a hazard to health and safety."

What is changing?

Properties smaller than 10,000m2 (2.47 acres) will only be allowed 2 dogs.

For allotments over 10,000m2 (2.47 acres), up to four dogs are allowed, but a permit is required, and dogs 3 & 4 must be

desexed.

Exemptions:

Dog owners with dogs currently exceeding the new Local Law limits will be permitted to keep the additional dog, or dogs, however they will need to obtain a permit from Council. Additional dogs kept under these permits cannot be replaced after 1 July 2023.

Authorised Inspection Program:

Between 1 March and 31 May 2023 Council Authorised Officers will be door knocking and inspecting every residence in all towns. The purpose of the visits and inspections will be to inform residents of the changes to our Local Laws, answer any questions residents may have and to conduct inspections to check compliance with the exhisting and new laws.

Residents who are not home at the time of visit will receive a calling card in their mailbox and a leaflet detailing the changes to the Local Law.

The QLD/NSW border town of Mungindi has been celebrating after its newest attraction was named as the winner in the national Grey Nomad Awards.

The Mungindi Sculpture Trail was shortlisted in the 2022 Best Grey Nomad Trail category after proving to national tourism leaders that it provided an ex-



ceptional experience for visitors aged over 50.

The 2.5-kilometre Trail is an open-air art gallery installation featuring ten raw and rustic sculptures by award-winning local artist Tony 'Nicko' McMillan, who tragically died in 2016 at 54 years of age and uniquely crosses the Queensland/ New South Wales border in two spots.

Launched in September 2022, the Balonne Shire Council worked in collaboration with the McMillan family, the Mungindi Progress Association and the Moree Plains Shire Council on the project, using Murray-Darling Basin Economic Development Program to pay tribute to Nicko and showcases the sculptures for visitor enjoyment.

Minister Opens Upgraded Mungindi River Park

The Queensland Minister for Regional Development, Manufacturing and Water, the Honourable Glenn Butcher MP came to our region to help celebrate the opening of the newly upgraded Mungindi River Park on the Barwon River.

The opening event was attended by a range of representatives of local and State governments and local community groups to celebrate the \$748,000 park upgrades.

The new park upgrades included, multiple barbecue areas and shelters, playground facilities, new accessible amenities with disability access, parking, landscaping, solar lighting, bollards, kerbing and pathways connecting the park to the township.

Balonne Shire Council Mayor Samantha O'Toole said this joint funding collaboration from all levels of Government is a great example of how significant local outcomes can be achieved when governments combine their efforts.

"The Barwon River is an incredible natural asset, and these upgrades to the Mungindi River Park will greatly benefit the local community on both sides of the border in terms of liveability, improved amenities and accessibility to attract more tourism to the area," Mayor O'Toole said.

"During this past festive season, locals in Mungindi held a Christmas event in the



upgraded park, which is a great example of the works already helping to bring the community together.

"The next step in improving the amenities in this area involves the \$300,000 construction of a new boat ramp at the site, to further improve local tourism opportunities by providing boat access to the beautiful Barwon River.

"The new boat ramp will improve safety and reduce environmental damage to the riverbank with the Moree Plains Shire Council securing funding from the New South Wales Government and the Balonne Shire Council set to construct and install the 20-metre boat ramp at the park, providing a site to launch small vessels."

The new park upgrades were proudly joint funded by the Australian Government under the Murray-Darling Basin Economic Development Program, the New South Wales Government, the Queensland Government and the Balonne Shire Council and Moree Plains Shire Council.

Exceptional seasonal conditions and good growing conditions have led to an increased presence of African Boxthorn (Lycium ferocissimum) within the Balonne Shire.

African Boxthorn is a thorny bush which restricts the movement of humans and most animals. The weed is easily recognised by its prolific red berries.

Birds spread the plant's seeds, usually depositing them under trees. As plants grow, they take over the shaded area, denying access to livestock, and creating the perfect harbour for feral animals.

Balonne Shire Council undertake control of African Boxthorn on stock routes.

All landowners and managers are urged to be on the lookout and remain vigilant in the control of this highly restricted Category 3 Woody Weed.

Under the Biosecurity Act 2014 all landholders have a "general Biosecurity obligation" to take all reasonable and practicable measures to minimise Biosecurity risks. Control methods may be manual, mechanical or by herbicide.

If you choose herbicide be sure to select the right herbicide and read the label well for application rates and safety.

African Boxthorn has been declared as a Weed of National Significance (WoNS) due to its potential to spread further and its economic, environmental and social impact. The declaration highlights the need for landowners and managers to renew their weed control commitments, particularly for widespread weeds that display these qualities.

This will help protect primary production industries in our region and our natural environment.
