

PLAN & PREPARE FOR BUSHFIRE SEASON

With bushfire season well under way, Queensland Fire and Emergency Services is warning property owners to pay attention to weather conditions and Fire Danger Ratings before carrying out farm work and urging travellers setting up campfires to do so responsibly.

Mowing and slashing activity has triggered several large grassfires already this season, and the dry and hot conditions are causing small fires to spread rapidly.

In times of high fire danger, as little as a spark from a grinder or a slasher hitting a rock, or an unattended campfire can spark a major grass fire, threatening lives and property.

Rural Fire Services Manager of Mitigation, Inspector Michael Welsh said the three most important factors for a property owner to remember is to check the weather before conducting work with power tools, ensure equipment is properly maintained, and to carry water or an extinguisher to put out small fires before they have the chance to spread.

Property owners should also clear grass around a welding or grinding site before starting work.

"With harvesting time approaching, we are also urging farmers to conduct all the recommended maintenance and clearing," Inspector Welsh said.

"Check all fire extinguishers are fully charged and have a mobile firefighting unit available."

Inspector Welsh said farmers should avoid carrying out work that could trigger a blaze during times of high fire danger.

A message from the Mayor

As we move into the warmer months, the weather brings with it the all too familiar challenges around water limitations and the heightened risk of bushfires to our region.

With numerous flood events over recent consecutive wet seasons, fuel loads have built up and dried out from frosts and that fuel is ready to burn, given the right conditions.

It is of vital importance that we are all prepared for any fire event that may occur throughout this bushfire season, as we have already had one instance of fire threat recently.

The Queensland Fire and Emergency Service has a detailed overview of how to prepare and plan for this bushfire season and I would urge everyone to go to their website so we can all do everything we can to keep our region and our families safe over the coming months.

Our seasonal weather patterns are creating another challenging issue for our Shire in the form of a fast-dwindling water allocation for the community of St George. Sunwater, Mallawa and Council have been working together to proactively explore ways of alleviating water supply shortages in St George during critically dry period when Beardmore Dam is at or below its minimum operating volume (such as last occurred in December 2019).

Jointly with Sunwater and Mallawa, we have developed a proposal to change the way that a positive reconciliation balance might be applied to

water accounts, but only when the dam is below its minimum operating volume. Please don't hesitate to contact Mallawa, Sunwater or myself directly to discuss and full details can be found on Council's website including our feedback form.

Many community members may not be aware that Council



does not currently own its water allocation for the community of St George. At the time when water and land titles were separated in the early 2000s, the water license was transferred to Sunwater and Council has since been on a term lease of the vital community asset. This is an unacceptable long-term arrangement for Council and currently sees us paying a premium for water compared to other water users on Jack Taylor Weir.

In recent times, I have represented Council at discussions with both Sunwater and the Department of Natural Resources Mines and Energy to secure the long-term ownership of this asset for our community. Although, we haven't to date been able to reach agreement for a suitable outcome for our community, I will continue to pursue this issue unrelentingly.

Landowners on rural properties need to develop a fire management strategy. That means they can identify their assets including pastures and the best way of protecting those assets.

"If they can just ensure their machinery is maintained and speak with their neighbours about how they can support one another. This can really help reduce fires. If they are considering the use of fire for hazard reduction, they've got to contact their local fire warden to obtain a permit to light fire," Inspector Welsh said.

"Fire wardens are good people to speak to for guidance on the

use of fire or other mitigation strategies such as putting in breaks with machinery or slashing and mowing."

Level 2 water restrictions now in place in St George

Council's remaining river water allocation in Beardmore Dam has now dropped to below 1,500 Megalitres, which has triggered Level 2 Water Restrictions in St George.

The aim of these Level 2 Water Restrictions is to prolong our remaining allocation of River Water for St George, which is predominantly used for outdoor use.

Mayor Samantha O'Toole is urging people in St George to do what they can to be waterwise with outdoor water use, so that we can preserve our precious river water for as long as possible.

"It was not that long ago that Beardmore Dam was brimming with water, but that water supply is steadily decreasing," Mayor O'Toole said. "Despite an extended period of high rainfalls in our region over recent years, we are now being met with forecasts for an El-Nino and drier weather ahead.

"St George has already been on Level 1 River Water Restriction since May of this year and at the rate our river water

is being consumed, we will be stepping up to Level 3 Water Restrictions in the very near future.

"Water is a precious resource for our Shire and the more we can all do to practise waterwise tips with our

Groundbreaking Environmental Research in our Region

Our region has hosted groundbreaking environmental research at the 130-hectare Richard Underwood Nature Refuge to the north of St George with ground penetrating radar technology to map out burrows of the world's rarest mammals, the Northern Hairy-nosed Wombat.

With an estimated total of around 315 individuals remaining, the Northern Hairy-nosed Wombat is listed as critically endangered and is one of the rarest mammals in Australia.



The Northern Hairy-nosed Wombat is the largest bur-

rowing mammal in the world

and their burrows can be up to 90 metres long, which highlights the challenge and knowledge that could be unlocked with this research.

The Wombat Foundation Director Leanne Brosnan is excited to see this project commence.

ENVIRO-COLUMN ILLEGAL DUMPING COSTS US ALL

Illegal dumping is the unlawful deposit of any type of waste material that is 200 litres or more in volume and includes household rubbish, garden waste, building and commercial waste or other materials that damage our natural areas.

Illegal dumping causes chemical and physical pollution in our neighbourhoods and waterways and spreads pests and weeds, including fire ants.

Dumpsites can lower property values and also attract other illegal activities as it may encourage others to dump more dangerous waste.

The removal of illegally dumped material in our Shire is a joint funded initiative by the Balonne Shire Council and Queensland Department of Environment and Science's Local Government Illegal Dumping Partnerships Program.
