

Balonne's New Team Of Councillors For 2024-28

A new team of Councillors have been sworn into Office following the local government elections on 16 March 2024 with a mix of three experienced Councillor's and the Mayor being reelected, along with three new faces.

The Electoral Commission of Queensland received a total of nine nominations for the six available positions of Councillor, with Mayor Samantha O'Toole being elected unopposed.

This election saw the retirement of two sitting Councillors Rod Avery and Alex Benn, who both thanked the Council for the opportunity to represent Balonne Shire during their terms.

After a relatively low-key campaign, three sitting Councillors Robyn Fuhrmeister, Bill Winks and Scott Scriven were reelected, and three new Councillors Andrew Dries, Jason Southern and Michaela Christensen were all successful in their bid at representing the Shire with Councillor Bill Winks being appointed Deputy Mayor at the Council's first meeting. Mayor Samantha O'Toole paid tribute to the retiring Councillor's, all the candidates who put their name forward and welcomed all the new Councillor's representing the Shire in this 2024-28 term.

"We have a lot to do, and I'm looking forward to working with this new team of Councillor's to deliver for the people of Balonne," said Mayor O'Toole

"I congratulate all of the candidates that sought to represent the Shire and welcome all of the successful Councillor's that now make up this new team.

A message from the Mayor

With the Council elections now all finalised, it has indeed been a pleasure to meet with the new Council and get the ball rolling on delivering for the Shire during this 2024-28 term of Council.

The voters of Balonne have certainly brought together a great blend of Councillors from across the Shire and I am looking forward to working with each and every one of them to continue making the Balonne an even better place to live.

In some ways it feels a little like deja vu that this new term has started in a similar way as my first term as Mayor, with local flooding creating a need for our Local Disaster Management Group to stand up and prepare for potential impacts. There has been a lot of rainfall throughout our region in recent times and this recent rainfall was quickly swept into our river systems

Our Local Disaster Management Group has been meeting regularly over the coming period and Council's team will be keeping the Emergency Dashboard up-to-date with any road closures and impacts as the flooding passes through.

On another concerning note, recently we joined together with 23 other Council's to oppose a proposal by mining giant Glencore to inject 330,000 tonnes of liquid carbon dioxide industrial waste into the Great Artesian Basin.

It beggars belief that such a risky proposal is even being considered, as any adverse impacts could potentially put at risk the drinking water for residents and

agricultural water supply stretching from the gulf right down to the border.

Together with these other Council's we are fully backing bodies like Agforce, Queensland Farmers Federation and Cotton Australia to call for the State and Federal governments to categorically reject this ridiculous proposal.

In other advocacy, we have received some significant media coverage recently in our objection to outrageous home insurance increases for our townships that are protected by flood levees. Insurance companies appear to be completely disregarding the protection our flood levees offer to our local communities and we will continue to advocate for them to do the right thing by our residents and their customers.

Road Condition Assessment Completed For All Roads In Balonne Shire



A road condition assessment has been completed for all roads in Balonne Shire through a contract, which utilises a mobile imaging survey tool to assess the conditions of road infrastructure.

The imaging tool allows the team to capture high resolution imagery with GPS plotting and records road conditions and defects simultaneously, all whilst travelling at 100km/h.

This process is a dramatic improvement to timeliness and safety of the previous process, which entailed teams manually assessing each road defect across the 2,600 kilometres of roads in the Shire.

Once any issues are identified the data is collated to reflect the state of each road in the Shire and Council uses this information to prioritise funding to address the most impacted areas.

Council has since acquired it's own imaging tool to continue the collation of data and management of road quality in our Shire.

Western Queensland Councils unite to protect community drinking water

24 Council's across Western Queensland have united to protect the health and wellbeing of their local communities from generational damage to their drinking water from foreign-owned mining giant Glencore.

Glencore has put forward an alarming proposal to inject 330,000 tonnes of liquid carbon dioxide industrial waste into one of Australia's greatest natural assets – the Great Artesian Basin, which is the lifeblood of communities and agriculture in 60% of the State's land mass.

The Western Queensland Alliance of Councils fully supports calls from the Queensland Farmers Federation (QFF), AgForce, Australian Lot Feeder's Association, Cotton Australia and concerned landholders for the State Government to reject this risky proposal that will put at risk the health of hundreds of local communities.

WQAC members expressed alarm that a



proposal to inject liquid carbon dioxide into the source of its community's drinking water, with a potential to create impacts for decades, would even be considered.

Mayor Samantha O'Toole expressed concern that such a proposal would even be entertained.

"The Great Artesian Basin provides so much more than drinking water for our communities, it supports agricultural production for livestock and fibre that feed and clothe our nation," said Mayor O'Toole.

"Water from the Great Artesian Basin is what makes life and farming in our region possible and deserves every effort to protect it from some risky industrial waste dumping scheme.

"We know that water moves through the Great Artesian Basin at a rate of around one to five metres per year, so this proposal has

the potential to impact our water supply for generations.

"Gambling with the lifeblood and health of Queensland's regional and remote communities, industry and economy is beyond irresponsible.

"The Great Artesian Basin is simply too precious to act as a test case for some foreignowned mining company."

Progress Continues at the St George Bush Garden

The St George Bush Garden continues to progress and improve as locals within our Indigenous Community volunteer their time and effort to improve the garden with thanks to ongoing funding from the Council.

The Bush Garden highlights the best

native attractions in our Shire, including Kangaroo Grass, Supplejack, Quandong, Scar Trees and a traditional Indigenous Yarning Circle.

Community member, Peter Goodwin, and a number of locals working with the St George Aboriginal Housing Community have been building the space for a number of years.

With more to come, the Bush Garden will certainly be a growing attraction in our Shire.





Shire-Wide Exclusion Fencing Delivering For Landholders

Since 2019, Council has secured Federal government grants and State government loan funding to deliver an ambitious wild dog exclusion fencing program in the Shire, which together with investment by farmers is projected to deliver a \$100 million increase in agricultural income per year and 230 jobs in the Shire.

A total of 1,692km of fencing has been constructed as part of the Balonne Shire Exclusion Fencing Program, which encompasses an area of 695,554 hectares on 87 properties. More than 66% of our Shire is now fenced with exclusion fencing.

Recently, Council commissioned an economic report by Hall Chadwick into the effects of the exclusion fencing program, which identified significant reduction in stock losses, greater diversification of production, a significant improvement in employment, stock reproductive rates and overall well-being of landholders.

The full funding for this project consisted of \$13 million in Federal grants and State government loan funding secured by Balonne Shire Council, which was a major catalyst that inspired additional private farm funding to create a total of \$44 million investment in exclusion fencing in the Shire.

This project has contributed to farmer confidence to invest \$42 million in plant and equipment, yards and sheds, internal fences and water improvements on local farms.

Balonne Shire Mayor Samantha O'Toole was heartened by the positive results detailed in the report with improvements to stock conditions, investment in the region, employment and landholder's well-being.

"The wild dog exclusion fencing program has been a concerted joint effort by Council and farmers over the last five years to make a lasting impact to the agricultural economy and to biosecurity," said Mayor O'Toole.



"We are now seeing the obvious benefits of this exclusion fencing program by returning to farmers the ability to manage their landholdings, which is reducing stock losses, crop damage, relieving grazing pressure and improving stock reproductive rates.

"This new fencing is also giving our landholders the opportunity to explore different types of farming to improve productivity in a variety of conditions, including an unexpected growth in cropping.

"The benefits from farmers regaining control of their properties are clear to see with around \$42 million being invested by farmers into plant and equipment to diversify their on-farm activities.

"The report indicates that over time this investment will increase the value of agricultural production in Balonne Shire by at least \$100 million per year.

"For our small Shire to see a \$100 million increase in agricultural income per year and around 230 extra jobs stemming from one program is a great outcome for the Shire."

The Balonne Shire Exclusion Fencing Program was made possible through funding Balonne Shire Council sourced from the Australian Government's Communities Combating Pest and Weed Impacts during Drought grant program and the Murray Darling Basin Economic Development Program, along with two rounds of Special Rate Scheme funding by the Queensland Treasury through Council.



Exciting progress continues at Council's Scott Street Duplex project in St George, which is being built in part to help alleviate existing housing pressure in the Shire.

The 3 bedroom townhouses will be part of Council's housing to attract staff and

their families moving to the Shire.

The project is now at lock up stage, with expected completion to be June this year.

This project is funded by State Government's Works 4 QLD grant funding scheme.

ENVIRO-COLUMN African Boxthorn - Lycium Ferocissimum

The African Box thorn is a quickly spreading spiny shrub which reproduces mostly by seeds that are commonly dispersed when the fruit are eaten by birds and other animals.

The fruit is green at first, ripening to a red or orange red shiny berry on a short down-turned stalk; with up to 70 seeds per fruit and is a breeding ground for pests such as fruit fly and dried fruit beetles.

The African Boxthorn is able to grow in a huge variety of climates, habitats, and soil types and can rapidly form impenetrable spiny thickets, reducing stock movement and also the land available for pasture.

Several control methods are effective for managing African Boxthorn including physical control - hand pull young plants, mechanical control - Clearing large stands of boxthorn by dozing, stick raking or blade ploughing and herbicide control - foliar spraying, basal bark treatment or root application.

Mungindi Water Security Project

Council has finalised construction of a new water bore to secure an ongoing water supply for residents of the crossborder town of Mungindi and are currently working through the process for the final connection of this bore.

This follows on from an agreement between the Balonne Shire Council and the New South Wales Government on a collaborative funding arrangement to improve water quality, supply and pressure on both sides of the border.

Funding for the project totalled \$1,475,852, which included a contribution of \$418,713 from Balonne Shire Council and \$1,057,139 of grant funding from the New South Wales Government.

Currently, the township of Mungindi draws its water supply from the Moree Plains Shire Reservoir in New South Wales and establishing the artesian bore in Mungindi supports the develop of a sustainable, secure and healthy water resources for our communities.
