

# Restrictions have changed, and the Border Zone has been expanded to all of the Balonne Shire.

The Border Zone includes:

- 2406 Mungindi
- 4486 Hebel and Dirranbandi
- 4487 St George
- **4488** Bollon
- 4497 Thallon and Nindigully

Residents can cross the QLD-NSW border with a permit, and travel within the Border Zone, as shown on the map above.

#### Due to outbreaks in Greater Brisbane, gatherings are restricted to 30 people.

If you've been to Greater Brisbane in the past 14 days and feel unwell, get a COVID-19 test and then isolate at home until you're cleared.

### **COMMON QUESTIONS**

#### How do I get a permit? (Queensland Border Declaration Pass)

You can apply for a Border Zone Resident Declaration Pass online at: **qld.gov.au/border-pass** Do this before you travel, as there may be a delay between applying for and actually receiving your pass.

# How do I prove I'm a Border Zone resident?

In addition to your Border Zone Resident Declaration Pass, you will need to show your driver's license, or another document that proves your address.

## I've been to a COVID hotspot? Can I come back home?

Not straight away.

When coming back to Queensland, you must to straight to hotel quarantine for 14 days - at your own expense.







#### Do I have to apply for a permit every time I want to cross the border?

#### No.

Your Border Zone Resident Declaration Pass is valid for seven days from the day you complete the application. If you are regularly crossing the border, you will need to complete a new border declaration pass every seven days.

However, if you develop COVID-19 symptoms within 7 days of completing the pass, you will need to apply again.

# Can I cross the border for appointments, or to help vulnerable family members?

Yes... but.

As a border zone resident, you can cross the border for any reason. However, if you travel outside of the Border Zone in NSW, you will have to pay for 14 days of hotel quarantine when you return.
