Stock Dogs in Town Areas

A Stock Dog is owned by a person who is a primary producer or person who is engaged or employed by a primary producer.

A Stock Dog is used primarily for the purpose of droving, protecting, tendering of working stock or being trained in droving, protecting or working stock.

All Stock Dogs MUST comply with the following:

- Permit
- Registration
- Micro-chipped
- Application made to full Council Meeting
