A message from the Mayor

I joined other councillors and infrastructure staff on a Council road run this week, which is essentially a tour of roads in the shire. It's a useful way for elected members to better understand the condition of our roads and the challenges our staff face in financial, technical and practical matters related to roads maintenance.

The aftermath of recent floods has been a major influence on our ability to undertake or complete road works, however this has also been a catalyst for thinking outside the square and looking for alternative methods of keeping our roads network open wherever we can.

In Bollon, we also met with local town supervisor, Mick, to check out the skate park, cemetery, show grounds and various sites in town.

The route took us through Bollon-Dirranbandi Road, Honeymah Lane, Cashelvale Road, Fernlee Road, Mulga Downs Rd, Woolerina Road, Jakelwar-Goodooga Road (South & North), Openbah Road and Whyenbah Road.

With technical staff on hand to give us insights into current and planned works, we inspected roads to ensure a level of service is carried across all Shire roads and better understand the state of condition of each road. The inspection of Jakelwar Goodooga Road helped us gain a better understanding of the proposed approach by the road crew.

Thursday saw the opening of the first electric vehicle charger in our shire, thanks to Australian Government funding through the Regional and Remote Communities Reliability Fund – Microgrids.

This project is spear-headed by All Energy Pty Ltd, who are working with Council, community and businesses this year to look at new ways of providing reliable and cost-effective energy. Microgrid technology has the potential to replace or supplement traditional electricity supplies for off-grid communities, a great concept for remote and re-



gional Australia.

I was surprised to learn that there are around 23,000 electric vehicles registered in Australia at the moment, with 8,000 of those in Queensland, and those figures are increasing every year. Manufacturers are now looking at ute and SUV designs in anticipation of greater future demand. The Federal and State governments are both looking at future funding to further develop electric vehicle routes beyond the coastal strip and urban areas, connecting regions and expanding the EV highway.

Also this week, along with Deputy Mayor Richard Lomman and CEO Matthew Magin, I met with senior Queensland Education representatives here in St George to discuss community concerns in the educational sector.

It was a very positive meeting, attended by Regional Director, Leanne Wright and Assistant Director General, Liam Smith, Assistant Regional Director, Adam Myers and Director, Rebecca Storck.

Our community's message has been heard, and we are keen to continue working with the Department, the school and the wider community to get the best outcome for our students and teachers.

In 2014, armed with a vision of bringing big music to small places, the Ontario Festival of Small Halls joined the family. The event was born of inspiration by the spirit of

community, hospitality, exceptional music, and fun that has made small halls festivals such treasured events.

Energising Balonne: Electric vehicle charging arrives in St George

The first electric vehicle (EV) charger in the Balonne has been switched on in St George, thanks to Australian Government funding through the Regional and Remote Communities Reliability Fund - Microgrids.

All Energy, Balonne Shire Council's project partner, secured the funding to undertake a study into more reliable, secure and cost-effective energy.

The EV charger in St George is just one part of the project, with 10kW solar arrays also being installed at the St George depot and the Dirranbandi pool, all funded by the Department of Industry, Science, Energy and Resources Microgrids grant.

Balonne Shire Council Mayor Samantha O'Toole said the project had the potential to provide reliable and cost-effective energy for businesses and communities across the Shire, while also providing tourism opportunities.

"Collectively, these systems will capture detailed data on power usage and power generation which will help to determine how our communities and businesses can access cheaper, more secure, and more reliable power," said Mayor O'Toole.

"With more than 23,000 electric vehicles registered in Australia and that market showing a definite upward turn, we believe the EV charger will provide additional tourism opportunities for our Shire and help individuals in our communities who may be interested in EV ownership," she said.

Ultimately, microgrid technologies could replace, upgrade or supplement existing electricity supplies for off-grid and fringeof-grid communities to deliver cheaper, more secure, and more

reliable power to improve local business, community services, and emergency resilience.

To help determine local business and community needs, All Energy Pty Ltd will be working with Balonne Shire Council, communities and businesses for the rest of this year.

The EV charger installed in St George is a 22kW fast charger, which will take approximately one hour to add 150km range to an electric vehicle and approximately 2.7 hours to fully charge an electric vehicle from empty, providing approximately 400km range. While many of these systems only have a power point, the St George charger also has a cable, which limits errors and provides maximum utility.
