



Council Working to Build Resilient Road Infrastructure

Unseasonal heavy rain and flooding events in our region have resulted in extensive damage and repeated road closures to major State roads across the Balonne Shire. Numerous local roads have also been affected.

Balonne Shire Mayor Samantha O'Toole said it is critical that the resilience of these vulnerable State roads be improved, helping our communities maintain connectedness and reduce hardship during and after natural disaster events.

"We are acutely aware of the serious impact these road closures have had on our communities, industries and businesses who rely on these vital public assets," she said. "Council has been tirelessly working with Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) and Queensland Reconstruction Authority (QRA) to work through the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) process and associated works as quickly as possible."

"I have been resolute in advocating for a positive outcome for the Betterment applications for the Castlereagh Highway between Dirranbandi and Hebel, meeting with a range of government ministers, senior department staff, the Director General of TMR and the CEO of QRA on multiple occasions."

"I am extremely confident that we will see a good result from our hard work and advocacy. While the process will

A message from the Mayor

As we find ourselves racing to the end of another year, I find myself reflecting on the year that was 2022. For Council, it as been a year of wins and losses, challenges and celebrations.

Our region has been repeatedly hit with extended periods of rain and flooding events, which has put an enormous amount of pressure on the State and local road networks running through our Shire. We know that constant road closures have had an enormous impact on our communities, industries, and businesses.

I want to reassure you that I, and our Council team, have been working tirelessly with the State Government to secure the required funding to address road impacts due to flooding. Whilst I am confident of a positive outcome from our advocacy efforts, these processes do take time to work through. We will continue advocating and working with the Queensland and Australian Government to ensure they are delivering long term solutions, rebuilding our roads to better withstand and minimise the impact of any future natural disasters.

On a more positive note, we have had some wins for education and learning opportunities in our Shire. We are working closely with Education Queensland to ensure we are getting the best educational outcomes for our shire. Education Queensland has committed to significantly increasing support to both the St George State High School and St George State Primary School including new positions such as the Lead Principal and additional Deputy Principals. These additional resources and the advertising of the substantial Principal position should further support students, family and community in 2023, assisting in better community partnerships in the future.

Still on education, Council have taken out four awards and been acknowledged as a national leader for partnering and collaborating with Country Universities Centre, the St George and District Chamber of Commerce and the broader community, to create The Hub in St George. These awards highlight the achievements of our team in growing educational opportunities within the region and for the community to 'grow its own' into the future. I have no doubt that this is just the beginning of many more great outcomes for us in this space.

Of course, there will be challenges in the



year ahead. Once again, we are bracing ourselves for the potential of further water licence buybacks in the Murray Darling Basin. Since 2016 we have been urging the Australian Government to work with our agricultural industries on developing sustainable measures that deliver water efficiencies while protecting our local economy, local employment and education capacity in our region.

We will continue to work with the Australian Government to achieve the best outcome for our region and the sustainability of our river system.

There are so many people in our shire who give and work tirelessly to keep us all healthy, safe, supported and protected. For these people I want to express my deep gratitude for all the work they do and hope they can find time to rest and recharge before the end of the year.

Christmas means different things for each of us, for me it is a time to focus on the importance of family, friends and our community. I hope we will all have an opportunity to enjoy the things that are important to us and bring us joy over the Christmas break.

take a little longer than we would all like, I am asking our residents and ratepayers to please be patient and bear with us as we work hard to ensure long term solutions are funded and this essential road is rebuilt to better withstand and minimise the impact of future natural disasters."

Betterment Funding Arrangements have now been submitted by TMR to complete a long-term upgrade to identified sections of the Castlereagh Highway between Dirranbandi and Hebel. TMR aim to release tenders for the work in March, Council will be one of many entities to submit a tender for this work. TMR have indicated that work should begin in the new financial year.

"While Council is limited by the fact that this is a Sate owned and controlled road, we will continue to advocate and work with TMR, the Queensland Government and the Australian Government to ensure this road is fixed as a matter of priority," concluded Mayor O'Toole.

MDBA Chief Announces Major Water Shortfall

Murray-Darling Basin Authority chief executive Andrew McConville addressed the National Rural Press Club at the end November, stating that the government had "no choice" but to start planning how to make up for the anticipated 190 to 315 gigalitre shortfall of its water recovery target.

Balonne Shire Council Mayor Samantha O'Toole is warning against considering water licence buybacks.


"Our river system is the lifeblood of our rural community, it is vital that we achieve a balance between the ongoing sustainability of our communities, our industries and the environment," she said.

"Since 2016, we have been actively advocating for the Australian Government to work with our nationally significant agricultural sector to help achieve long-term sustainable water efficiency measures that do not cause significant impacts to our rural and remote community."

The Murray Darling Basin Authority (MDBA) Northern Basin Review, released in 2016, confirmed that water buybacks undertaken in the Balonne Shire have had enormous and devastating impacts on the sustainability and viability of our nationally significant agricultural industry, associated rural industries and employment in our Shire.

The MDBA Review stated that Dirranbandi lost an estimated 27% of its irrigation area and more than 15% of agriculture and non-agriculture private sector jobs since water buybacks commenced. School enrolments dropped by 50% in the five years prior to that report being released.

The report also clearly demonstrat-



ed that businesses operating in the Balonne Shire were under significant stress as a result of buybacks. In St George, jobs in agriculture dropped by more than 15% and non-agriculture private sector jobs were down more than 20%.

"We recognise the efforts of the Australian Government in acknowledging and attempting to address some of the issues created by water buybacks. However, based on the modelling conducted as part of the MDBA report, it is abundantly clear

that farms within our Shire cannot sustain any further buybacks without further aggravating the significant social and economic disruption already endured by our communities," said Mayor O'Toole.

"We cannot sustain and will not support any further water buybacks in any way."

Balonne Shire Council will continue to work with the Australian Government to achieve the best outcome for the region and the sustainability of the river system.

The Hub is continuing to exceed targets and expectations with over 75 students now using the facility, proving the community need for a supported educational experience," she said.


"This award is an acknowledgement of the work Council is doing to support hard working students across Balonne to achieve their goals and use their skills and knowledge in their own hometown."

Balonne Shire Council Welcomes New Councillor

Alex Benn was officially sworn in as a councillor at Balonne Shire Council on Thursday 10 November, after being elected unopposed, as declared by the Electoral Commission of Queensland (ECQ).

Councillor Benn has filled the vacancy created after former Councillor Ian Todd resigned in September 2022, following more than five years in the role.

The ECQ declared the result on Wednesday 2 November 2022. Alex Benn was declared the elected candidate after the ECO received one candidate nomination for the by-election, which was due to be held later this month. He is excited to take on the role of representing his community.

"It is an honour to serve the people of the Balonne Shire. I am looking forward to working with the Council team and residents to support the Council ethos of welcoming, connected and innovative communities, where economies are strong, and opportunities are abundant." Councillor Benn said.

Mayor Samantha O'Toole was delighted to welcome Councillor Benn to the Balonne Shire team.

"I would like to congratulate Councillor Benn on the result," said Mayor O'Toole.

Councillor Benn attended his first council meeting on 17 November 2022. He will serve as councillor until the next election which will be held in March 2024.

New Remote Cameras Help Monitor Floods

Council has installed a range of remote access cameras in 36 strategic locations across the Shire's waterways to deliver real-time monitoring of flood levels at roadways throughout the region.

Each Camera is fully self-contained and run from solar power linked to the Balonne Shire Emergency Dashboard and feeding information back to Council's Infrastructure team.

Each location has different requirements including some that also activate Flood Warning Lighting to alert both Council and local traffic. The three types of cameras, Tilting Mast cameras, Local Flood Warning Signs and Tower camera sites.

Each Camera is fully self-contained and run from solar power linked to the Balonne Shire Emergency Dashboard and feeding information back to Council's Infrastructure team.
