A message from the Mayor

On 29 June, Council handed down its budget for the 2023/24 financial year, which highlighted the great financial shape our Council is in.

The budget featured a total revenue of over \$108 million, expenditure of over \$90 million, a net operating surplus of over \$1.3 million and a forecast of ongoing surpluses for the next ten years. This is one of the largest budgets from recent years and the culmination of many years working towards financial sustainability and lobbying for change in the distribution of the Federal Assistance Grants.

Our commitment to fiscal responsibility has put us in a position to be able to deliver over and above for the residents of Balonne. Over the coming financial year, we have forecast over \$26 million in our Capital Works Program and a total of over \$65 million allocated for road maintenance and upgrades throughout the Shire. This is an immense amount of infrastructure works to be delivered and follows on from the delivery of over \$80 million on our road network over the previous two financial years.

These figures really do highlight the outstanding efforts of our Council team when contrasted with the annual revenue from rates and charges of around \$10-11 million per annum.

Despite significant challenges in terms of increasing prices for materials, transport costs and supply chain delays, Council has also managed to keep average rates & utilities increases to below CPI with on average an additional \$5 per week for a



typical residential property.

Our Shire has been through a lot of adversity over recent years with five recent flood events, so this positive outcome with the Council's finances is very welcome news for our residents.

Thank you to our Councillors, Executive Team and staff who have contributed to developing the budget, rating strategies and operational plan.

Results like this, along with the efforts of our Council team also allow us to deliver on long sought-after projects such as the revitalisation and redevelopment of the Beardmore Dam recreation area. Many of our long-term residents would remember the glory days of this recreation area and the countless weekends spent enjoying this facility with family and friends.

Balonne budgets for a decade of surpluses

Balonne Shire Council has handed down its largest budget in recent years for the 2023/24 financial year with a total revenue of \$108.67M and expenditure of \$90.17M with a net operating surplus of \$1.372M and a forecast of ongoing surpluses for the next ten years.

Despite significant challenges in terms of increasing prices for materials, transport costs and supply chain delays, Council has also managed to keep average rates & utilities increases to below CPI with on average an additional \$5 per week for a typical residential property.

Key Points about the 2023/24 budget:

- Total revenue is \$108.67M and expenditure of \$90.17M.
- Capital works program for 2023/24 is forecast at \$26.43M.
- The approved flood recovery submissions for roads we have completed include \$58.9M at the end of 2021/2022; an estimated \$22M completed in 2022/2023 and a further estimate of \$50M to be completed by June 2024.

Balonne Shire Council Mayor Samantha O'Toole said our Shire has been through a lot of adversity over recent years with five recent flood events, so this positive outcome is very welcome news for our Shire.

"Getting our budget back into surplus whilst delivering the largest capital expenditure this Council has seen, just goes to show what can be done with effective planning, perseverance, and a commitment to our community," said Mayor O'Toole.

"Council's responsible budget management and success in bringing the budget back into surplus helps us to continue planning and delivering a broad range of projects that makes our Shire a more attractive and liveable place to live."

Budget delivers key projects across the Shire

The 2023/24 budget is set to deliver a capital works program of \$26.43M.

Balonne Shire Mayor Samantha O'Toole said Council's commitment to fiscal responsibility has put us in a position to be able to deliver over and above for the residents of Balonne.

"This budget is in line with our Corporate Plan and goal to maintain strategic investment in infrastructure whilst continuing to deliver projects and programs that enhance a sense of community."

The key focus for 2023/2024 budget will be the finalisation of the following key projects, the majority of which were made possible through State and Federal funding:

- Upgrade of Victoria St (Federal Local Roads Community Infrastructure funds (LRCIP) and Federal Murray Darling Basin Economic Development Program (MDBEDP))
- Dirranbandi Rail & River Precinct Federal Murray Darling Basin Economic Development Program (MDBEDP))

- Balonne Shire Business Improvement Program (beautification project for shop facades and energy efficiency (MDBEDP)
- Balonne Shire Business Mentoring program (MD-BEDP)
- Betterment road programs on Jakelwar-Goodooga Rd and Whyenbah Rd (Queensland Reconstruction Authority – QRA)
- \$50M in Flood recovery road works (QRA)
- Improvement to the Beardmore Dam Facility (Queensland's Fishing Infrastructure Grant and Works for Queensland (QFIG-W4Q))

Council will also commence delivery of the following key projects in 2023/2024:

- St George Industrial Development (LRCIP)
- Mungindi Water Security Project (New South Wales Cross Board fund – NSWC-BISF)
- Expansion of the St George cemetery
- Construction of staff accommodation (W4Q)

Community programs & facilities a strong focus in the budget

Council's 2023/24 budget is set to deliver on its vision to create a welcoming, connected and innovative community, where economies are strong, and opportunities are abundant.

Projects and programs set to be delivered in this budget cover events, grants programs, parkland and sporting facility upgrades, which help to create the fabric of our local communities.

Balonne Shire Mayor Samantha O'Toole said our warm, welcoming and connected community is one of our greatest features and this budget aims to further build on the lifestyle that we all enjoy.

"Our parklands will gain a boost in this budget with a revitalisation of the Beardmore Dam facilities sure to be a welcome addition to our Shire.

"We will be investing around \$835,000 on revitalising parklands and sporting facilities across the Shire to provide community with places to meet and enjoy all that our outdoor facilities offer.

"Our community development programs such as RADF grants, community sponsorships, youth projects and mental health and well-being programs will continue to benefit our community with a total investment of \$367,000.

"Horse enthusiasts are sure to welcome our \$80,000 commitment for a feasibility study to plan for an Equine and Event Centre for the Shire.

"This budget has allocated an investment of around \$94,000 to maintain showground facilities throughout the Shire so that they can continue to be central places for our communities to gather and connect with each other.

"Our community buildings and Libraries will benefit from \$236,000 to upgrade and improve facilities so that our community can continue enjoying the benefits of these assets.

"In all, we feel that this budget will ensure that we continue to build on the strong community spirit we in the Balonne have all come to know and enjoy."

Budget set to upgrade roads across the shire

Balonne Shire Council has handed down its largest budget in recent years with with over \$65M allocated for road maintenance and upgrades.

This achievement is the culmination of many years working towards financial sustainability and lobbying for change in the distribution of the Federal Assistance Grants.

Council has maintained a good position to increase revenue through contract works with the achievement of ISO accreditation for its quality, environmental and safety systems for transport and infrastructure along with maintaining Transport & Main Roads accreditation.

Balonne Shire Mayor Samantha O'Toole said Council's commitment to fiscal responsibility has put us in a position to be able to deliver over-and-above for the residents of Balonne.

"Obviously, the delivery of road works is crucial to our Shire and it takes up the lion's share of our forecast expenditure for the coming financial year.

"As a Shire with a small population spread over a large geographical area that relies on heavy transport haulage, Council is focussed on doing what it can to continue improving our road network.


"Having the budget in such a strong position allows us to continue delivering road projects that allow, businesses, residents and visitors to travel safely throughout our region."

Council offers a series of Tourism Events Grants to support event organisers in developing, promoting and executing events which contribute to growing tourism in the Shire.

Priority will be given to events which increase visitation to the Balonne Shire, generate positive media coverage, and stimulate the local economy. Examples of past funded events include:

- McIntyre 900, St George (Major Event)
- St George Show, St George (Destination Event)
- Grazing at the Waterhole, Thallon (Regional
- Easter in the Vines, St George (Regional Event) The program provides a tiered range of grants to support event organisers to develop, promote and host events which make a positive and ongoing contribution to the Shire.

Funding is available across four (4) categories for pre-existing Shire events:

- Regional Events (up to \$3,000)
- Destination Events (up to \$4,000)
- Major Events (up to \$7,000)
- Hallmark Events (up to \$10,000)
- New Event Development (one-off, up to \$3,000) Round 3 opens on 1 August and closes on 1 September with applicants notified in October 2023. The assessment process is competitive; applications will be

assessed on merit against the selection criteria outlined in the funding policy. Note that all event applications must be submitted a minimum of six months before the event occurs.

ENVIRONMENT COLUMN Don't dump aquarium contents!

Although some exotic fish, snails and plants can be kept in private aquariums, it is illegal to release them into the wild because of the serious negative impacts they can have on our native environment.

The introduction of exotic species into Queensland's natural waterways can affect native aquatic plants and animals through direct competition for food and space, predation, changes to their habitat and the introduction of exotic diseases and parasites.

Exotic fish, snails and plants have already established themselves in Queensland and their removal is almost impossible. Prevention of further populations in the wild is the best course of action.



It's time to focus on waterwise measures


It was not that long ago that Beardmore Dam was brimming with water, but as the below image shows, that water supply is steadily decreasing.


